## Ice Show Criteria

**Ice show criteria is reviewed every two years. The information below was revised 8/19/14 and reflects revisions made and approved by voting members of the Fraser Figure Skating Club.** Membership requirements, Ice Shows and contracted ice refers to Fraser Figure Skating Club exclusively.

Points are calculated annually prior to the Spring Ice Show application deadline (Jan. 1 to Dec.31 of the previous show year, example Show “2015” based on points accumulated from Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 2014)

- To add points for Consecutive Ice Show, a skater must participate in a Solo, Feature or Group Number; a skater who only participates in a Production or Synchro Number will not fulfill the consecutive Ice Show requirement. Any injury that prevents a skater from participating in the Ice Show will not interrupt the consecutive pattern.
- Academic waiver: Must have documentation to provide participation is mandatory; would affect school grade if not attended (**not for recreational activities**), Must be approved by the Board of Directors or the Ice Show Director in order not to interrupt the consecutive pattern.
- All Ice Show participants must be FFSC members in good standing

### Solos and Features – earned by points

In the event of a tie points, the tie will be broken using Club seniority. Any skater having a solo or feature must participate in their respective Junior or Senior production number.

#### Eligibility

Solos: Eight skaters who have earned the most points – this includes any skater who would also qualify for special category solo (this takes precedent).

Features: 9 skaters who have earned the second highest points

#### Requirements

- Four sessions of contracted Club ice during the current fall season
- Last two consecutive years as First Club Member – (June 1 – May 31)
- Last two consecutive Spring Ice Shows

#### Points earned through longevity and achievement

| ➤ Each Dance test passed – Pre-Gold & Gold                   | ½ point per test   |
| ➤ Each pairs test passed – Pre-juvenile & below              | ½ point per test   |
| ➤ Each pairs test passed – Juvenile & above                  | 1 point per test   |

#### Points earned through competitions

- All competitions must be USFS sanctioned and take place at two or more competitions.
- Skaters are **required** to submit documentation of each attended competition, along with standings (results)
- Qualifying competitions must be attended prior to the Spring Ice Show application deadline (Jan-Dec)
  - Freeskate competition– two-point max. 1 point each
  - Test track competition – two point max. 1 point each
  - Compulsory, moves, spins, artistic showcase, or dance– two-point max. 1/4 point each
  - Placement points for freestyle competition results of 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> place ¼ point each  
(1/4 point per competition – (maximum 1 point) Points can **NOT** be earned on test track)
  - Preceding season on a Fraser Eclipse Team 1/2 point
  - Current season on a Fraser Eclipse team – 1 point
  - Top four placement in non-qualifying event at Regionals, current season 1 point
  - Top four placement in qualifying event at Regionals, current season 2 points
  - Regional competitor – attended Regionals, current season 1 point

## Michigan Basic Skill Skill Series Solo

- \*For skaters who participated current season
- \*Must be one of FFSC "Top 2" ; highest points earned, in Freestyle only, in levels Basic 5 to No Test
- \*Skater must have attended a minimum of six (6) Michigan Basic Skill Series Competitions in freestyle, level Basic 5 to No Test. (compulsory events are not counted in this solo category)
- \*Skater must have contracted, with our club, a minimum of four (4) sessions of club ice.
- \*Skater(s) awarded this solo must participate in the Basic Skill Series Production Number
- \*Skater is only allowed to achieve this solo one time.
- \*The Ice Show number – music will not exceed 1 minute 30 seconds.
- \*Skaters/parents will provide and be responsible for costumes, pro fees, ice, and all that pertains to their number.
- \*FFSC will add this number to our ice show order.

## Solos for Regional Finalists – Current Season Eligibility -

- Regional finalists in non-qualifying or qualifying event with top four placement in Freestyle, pairs, or dance division
- Current member of the FFSC
- Last two consecutive years as First Club Member–(two completed years defined as June 1 – May 31)
- Last two consecutive Spring Ice Shows

## Solos for Graduating Seniors

### Eligibility

- Graduating High School senior
- Current member of the FFSC
- Four sessions of contracted Club ice during the fall season of Junior year
- Two sessions of contracted Club ice during the fall season of Senior year
- Last two consecutive years as First Club Member – (June 1 – May 31)
- Last two consecutive Spring Ice Shows

## PRODUCTION NUMBERS

### Junior Production Number

**Age requirement:** 12 years or younger as of the Ice Show application deadline

**Skating requirement:** Passed Pre-preliminary Freeskate, participated in the production number previous year, or pass the FFSC Production try-out (consists of a loop jump, flip jump, and sit spin- four revolutions).

### Senior Production Number

**Age requirement:** 13 years of age or in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade as of the Ice Show application deadline

**Skating requirement:** Passed Preliminary Freeskate, participated in the production number previous year, or pass the FFSC Production try-out (consists of a loop jump, flip jump, and sit spin – four revolutions)

### Freestyle Number

**Skating requirement:** Passed Intermediate Freeskate or must pass FFSC Production try-out (consists of axle, camel-four revolutions, and a lay back---note: layback for girls; sit spin for boys). Skills must be completed 1 out of 3 attempts to pass. Must try-out every year, unless passed intermediate Freeskate. Fee is waived if participated in the number the previous year, but must still try out for completion of skills.

### Club Number

**Requirement:** Any current FFSC First Club, Second Club, or Initiation member is good standing

### Michigan Basic Skill Series Production Number

Minimum participation in four (4) Michigan Basic Skill Series Competition any level through No Test

**\*\*ONLY ONE SOLO IS AWARDED PER SKATER- No skater can have more than one solo.**

**Qualifying solo by points takes precedent.**

The FFSC Board of Directors reserves the right to add any Solos and/or Features as they deem necessary based upon recommendation from the Ice Show Director(s) and Ice Show Committee - such changes will not replace or change any Solo or Feature having earned position by points. The FFSC Board or Directors is not responsible for any incorrect miscalculations of points submitted on behalf of the skater resulting in the loss of a Solo or Feature.
